হীরালাল মজুমদার মেমোরিয়াল কলেজ ফর উইমেন, উত্তর২৪ পরগনার একটি বিশিষ্ট মহিলা মহা বিদ্যালয়। স্বর্গীয় অমৃত লাল মজুমদার এই মহাবিদ্যালয়ের এর স্থাপনা করেন।

ধর্ম নির্বিশেষে স্থানীয় মেয়েদের উচ্চশিক্ষার সুযোগ প্রদানের প্রাথমিক লক্ষ্য নিয়ে কলেজটি ১০ আগস্ট, ১৯৫৯ সালে যাত্রা শুরু করে। এখন কলেজ কম্পিউটার সাক্ষরতার সাথে নতুন বি.কম কোর্স এবং সার্টিফিকেট কোর্স সহ ২৭টি বি.এ ও বি.এস. সি সাধারণ ও ১৮ টি সাম্মানিক কোর্সে পাঠ দান করে। এই মহাবিদ্যালয় এলাকার ছাত্রীকুল এবং সংখ্যা লঘু নারীদের উর্দু (সাম্মানিক) এবং হিন্দি ও উর্দু সাধারণ কোর্স সহ অন্যান্য বিষয়ে পাঠদান করতে পেরে গর্বিত।

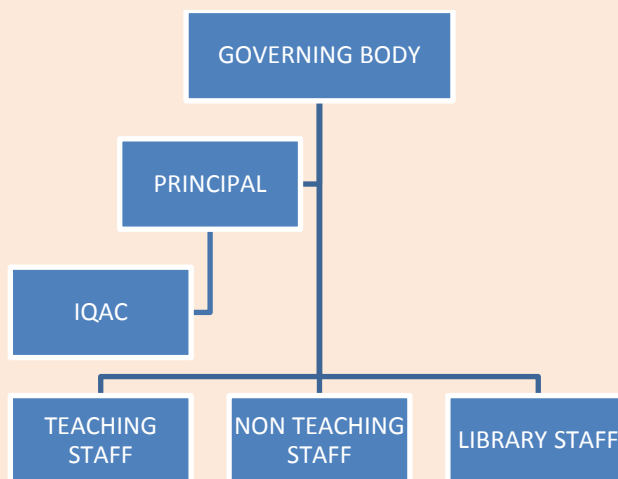

To keep pace with the advancement of ICT coupled with the changing and diversified needs of its member, the central library is evolving from a traditional library to an automated modernized library. Library always aims to complement classroom teaching and aid self learning process. Well trained and helpful library staff is available for the purpose. There is a regular annual addition of books and the library collection is being updated with latest editions. Open Source Library Management Software KOHA (Version : 3.16.04) is used to provide automated library services.

Library Rules

- 6) Students are bound to replace lost or damaged books with the latest edition, failing which the current market price of the book will be realized from her.
- 7) Student of all the years must return all the books borrowed from the Central Library after their pre final (Test) Examination
- 8) It is mandatory for THIRD YEAR STUDENTS to collect LIBRARY CLEARANCE CERTIFICATE from the library after their Test Examination by returning all books and surrendering library cards. Students need to show this certificate in the office before form fill-up.
- 9) The books marked as "NOT TO BE LENT OUT" and periodicals (both journals and magazines) are meant for consultation within reading room only and strictly not for home issue.
- 10) **Use of computer and internet is meant for learning purposes only. Sending e-mails, browsing social networking site or obscene website, playing games, music, watching videos, downloading any kind of software are strictly prohibited.**
- 11) Silence and strict disciplines should be maintained in the reading-room. Sleeping, eating, spitting and disturbing others shall be treated as cases of misconduct.

ADMISSION REGULATIONS¹

for

**B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.(Hons./Genl.)/B.Mus.(Hons./Genl.) Under
Choice Based Credit System(CBCS)**

2021-22

1. AdmissionQualifications:

A candidate who has passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) or its equivalent examination is eligible to seek admission to the First Semester of the Six Semesters B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.(Hons and Genl) or B.A.Music.(Hons. and Genl.) Course of studies provided **he/she has also passed in English having full marks not being less than 100.**

In any case, where there is an ambiguity regarding the admissibility of a particular examination at the Higher Secondary (10+2) level of study, **the matters shall be referred to the Equivalence Committee of the University who shall determine the eligibility of the said examination.**

However, no candidate, in general, shall be allowed for admission after a lapse of more than 3 years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination.

¹Provisional, subject to further revision by higher Education Department/West Bengal State University

Those desirous to do so will seek permission from the University Authority.

The year of admissions shall not be taken into account while calculating 3 years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination.

For the purpose of determining eligibility for admission to the Honours Course, aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks of **top four subjects in order of marks secured by a candidate. However, marks in compulsory Environmental Education/Studies shall not be taken into account** for calculation of aggregate marks. If the subject "Environmental Science" is studied as an elective subject of 100 marks, it may be taken into account for the purpose of determining the aggregate marks.

2. Eligibility Criteria

2(a) A candidate taking up Honours Course in a subject must have obtained:

- i) A minimum of 50% marks in the aggregate and 45% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.
In case of B.Mus. (Hons.) 45% marks in the aggregate and 45% marks in the subject Music in the pre-qualifying examination.
OR
- ii) 55% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.

OR

- iii) 50% marks in the aggregate when the candidate has not studied the subject in his/her previous qualifying examination provided all the other clauses are satisfied.
- 2 (b) However, candidates belonging to the Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe Community taking up Honours Course of study must have obtained a minimum of 40% marks in the aggregate and 40% marks in the subject or related subjects at the previous qualifying examination, as the case maybe.

3. Candidates from other Boards

- 3(a) Students, who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) examination or its equivalent from the **All India Boards/Councils or State Boards/Councils including Open Schools and vocational studies**, are eligible for study at the UG level.
- 3.(b) Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) examination or its equivalent from the **All India Boards/Councils (i.e. CBSE, ISC and National Institute of Open Schooling)** are not required to submit the **Migration Certificate** for getting Registration under this University.

4. Choice of Courses

4. (a). For the B.A./B.Sc. (Honours) Course of Studies, a candidate is required to choose his/her Honours in a discipline and two other disciplines for Generic Elective courses, from among Group-I to Group-VIII as follows by taking not more than one discipline from any of the groups mentioned hereunder:
- 4.(b). For the B.Sc. (General) Course of Studies, a candidate is required to choose three disciplines from among Group-I to Group-VIII as follows by taking not more than one discipline from any of the groups mentioned hereunder:
4. (c). For the B.A. (General) Course of Studies, a candidate is required to choose two main disciplines and for Generic Elective courses the student is required to choose a third discipline, from among Group-I to Group-VIII as follows by taking not more than one discipline from any of the groups mentioned hereunder:

GROUPS OF DISCIPLINES (applicable for HMMCW)

Gr. I: Physics, Zoology, Education, Women Studies

Gr. II: Mathematics, History, Environmental Science

Gr. III: Chemistry, Sociology, Music, Sanskrit

Gr. IV: Botany, Economics, Food & Nutrition

Gr. V: Political Science, Electronics

Gr. VI: Geography, Psychology, Philosophy, Journalism & Mass Communication

Gr. VII: Physiology, English

Gr. VIII: Anthropology, Computer Science, Bengali, Urdu

5. Mandatory Subject Requirement (at H.S. level) (refer to table given in website) (tables 7a and 7b to be inserted)

A candidate shall be allowed to take up the discipline(s) under heading "A" if he/she had passed the subject(s) under heading "B" at the previous qualifying examination.

6. Some Special conditions for admission to Honours Courses as follows:

To take up Honours in any subject, the candidate has to pass in that "subject" or "any related subject" in the H.S. examination. In the above table, in general, "subject" and "related subject" are given under the columns A and B. However, the following restrictions supersede the previous clause.

(i) Economics: A)

A

candidates shall be allowed to take up Honours in Economics if she has passed in Mathematics at the H.S. or its equivalent Examination. However, it is advisable that a student pursuing Honours in Economics takes Mathematics as a Generic Elective (for pursuing higher studies in the subject in future).

B. A student shall be given B.Sc Honours degree in Economics if she takes up at least one discipline from the Science group for his/her Generic Elective (as given in sec 7b) and shall be awarded B. A Hons degree in Economics if both the disciplines chosen for Generic Electives are from the Arts & Humanities group (as given in sec 7a).

A student will be given B.Sc degree in Economics if he/she earns required number of credits in the structure appropriate for B.Sc General and chooses at least one discipline from science group besides economics.

A student will be given B.A. degree in Economics if he/she earns required number of credits in the structure appropriate for B.A. General and chooses the other main discipline (and not the Generic Elective) from Arts & Humanities group, besides economics.

ii) **Education/Sociology:** Subjects Psychology, Philosophy, Mathematics, Sociology, Education, Economics, Political Science, History be treated as related subject.

iii) **Philosophy:** Subject Psychology is a related subject.

iv) **Food and Nutrition:** A candidate shall be allowed to take up Honours in Food and Nutrition if she has passed in Chemistry at the H.S. Examination and has to take up **Chemistry as one of the elective subject.**

A student will only be given the B.Sc degree for Food and Nutrition subject. It is mandatory for the student to choose both the subjects from the Science group (as given in sec 7a) to be eligible for the aforesaid degree.

Minimum 50% marks in the aggregate when the candidate has not studied the subject earlier.

- ▶ 40% marks in the aggregate or 40% marks in the subject or related subject for candidates belonging to S.C. / S.T. category at the 10+2 level. Candidates Applying for Food & Nutrition (H) must qualify in Chemistry (Theory) in Higher Secondary.

For General Subject

- ▶ Candidates applying for General Course must secure minimum qualifying marks in the concerned subject in 10+2 Examination.
- ▶ For rest of the criteria candidates are requested to go through the Admission Regulation as posted under Online admission button in the Website.

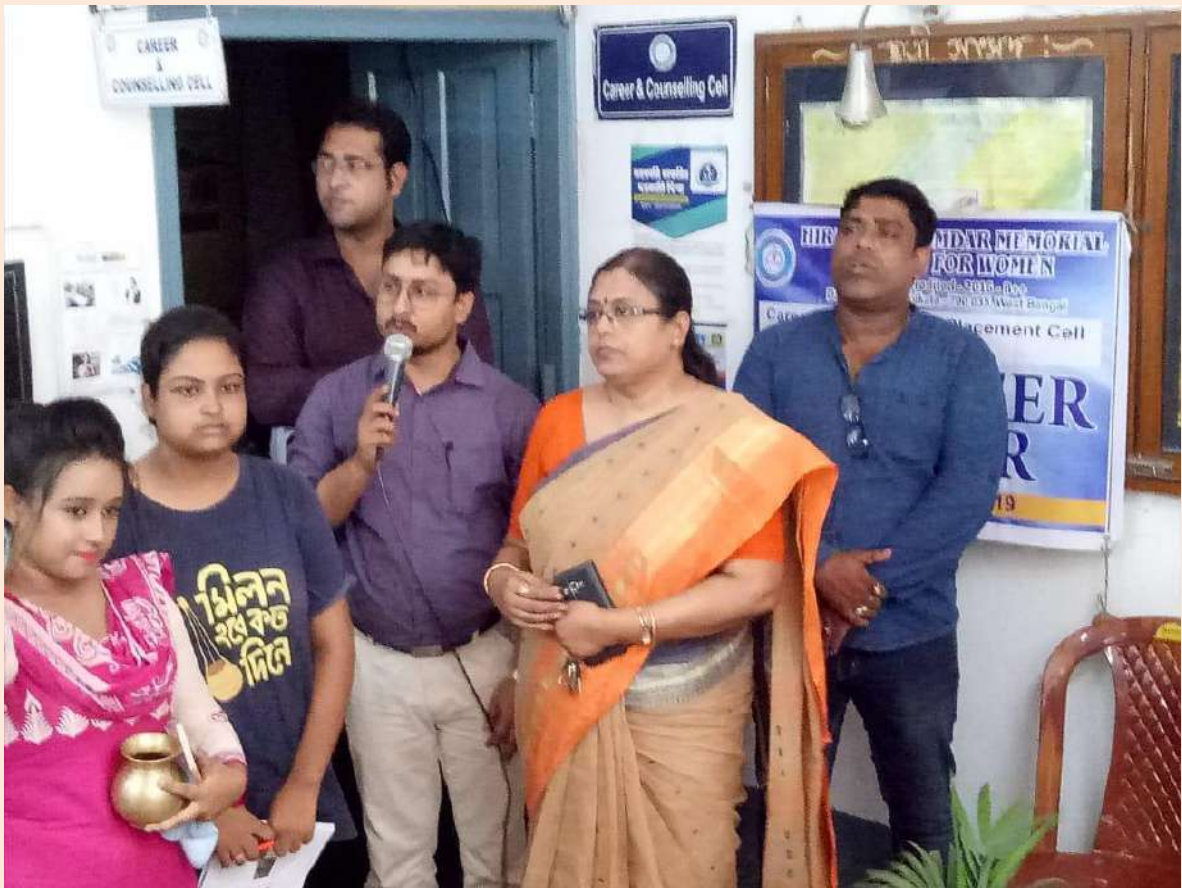
